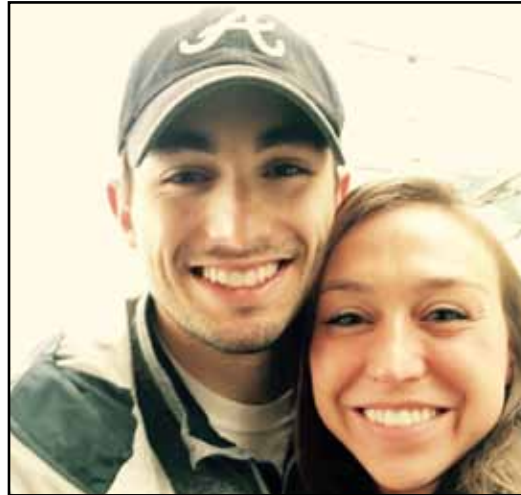

Parking Lot Reminder

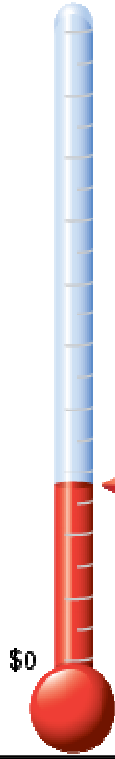
